Pursuant to the federal Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552, I request access to and copies of all records pertaining to CEQ analysis of economic losses, both insured and uninsured, due to extreme weather events, including any records pertaining to the veracity of the chart produced by the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change entitled, "Global Costs of Extreme Weather Events" [1], and all records pertaining to the veracity of the extrapolation of the IPCC chart's data as prepared by the requestor [2], and all records of funds appropriated, budgeted, allocated, committed, programmed, expended, encumbered, utilized, or spent for the purposes of determining trends and/or projections concerning the strength of extreme weather events. appeal your decision to withhold any information or to deny a waiver of fees.

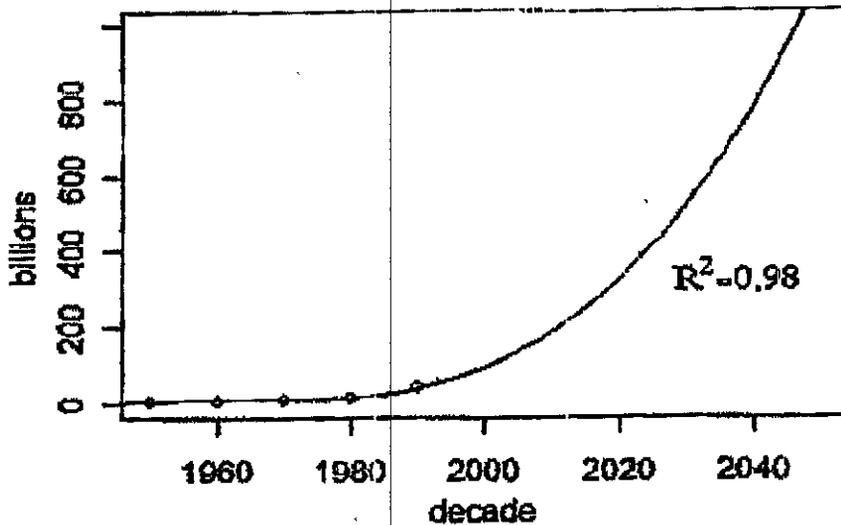
I look forward to your reply within 20 business days, as the statute requires.
