Statement from OMB Director Mick Mulvaney:

**Budgetary Impact Analysis for Executive Order Entitled
“Establishing Discipline and Accountability in the Environmental Review and Permitting
Process for Infrastructure”**

This executive order streamlines the environmental review and permitting process for infrastructure by requiring the designation of a single lead Federal agency responsible for each major infrastructure project, among other improvements. Implementing this executive order would have a *de minimis* impact on costs and revenues to the Federal Government. The benefits of this executive order include increased coordination between Federal agencies with respect to infrastructure permitting and environmental review, and increased transparency, accountability, and timeliness regarding environmental review and authorization decisions, among other benefits. Implementing this executive order would have a *de minimis* impact on mandatory and discretionary obligations and outlays, as well as on revenues to the Federal Government, in the 5-fiscal year period beginning in fiscal year 2017. The agencies anticipated to be impacted by this executive order include the General Services Administration, the Executive Office of the President, and all agencies involved in infrastructure permitting and environmental review.
