

Fiscal Year 2022 President's Budget, Native American Programs

¹ In FY 2022, the Office of Indian Energy will increase its financial assistance and technical assistance to support Tribal Nations transition to clean energy, providing energy access to unelectrified homes, addressing energy poverty, and serving more Tribes across the Nation. Additional initiatives focus on transitioning Tribal Colleges and Universities (TC&U) to clean energy will be instituted, along with initiatives for climate justice and seven generation energy planning.

² DOE's Legacy Management Program includes the Long-Term Surveillance & Maintenance (LTS&M) Program; the Defense-Related Uranium Mines (DRUM) Program; the Applied Science and Technology (AS&T) Program; the Education, Communications, History, & Outreach (ECHO) Program; and the Environmental Justice (EJ) Program. The funding increase in the FY 2022 Budget supports additional work within Legacy Management's (LM) existing Defense-Related Uranium Mines (DRUM) Program to verify and validate (V&V) the condition of mines on Navajo and other Tribal lands. LM will establish a cooperative agreement and team to engage Tribal communities, develop plans, and characterize environmental and physical conditions of DRUM and mill sites on Navajo and other Tribal lands; and to determine necessary short- and long-term corrective actions. This work will ensure the protectiveness of the mines and mills on Tribal Lands where uranium ore was mined and processed by the government.
