

## The American Rescue Plan's Impact on Texas on Two-Year Anniversary

- Powered a Strong Recovery with Texas unemployment falling to 3.8%: Texas's unemployment rate has fallen from 6.7% in January 2021 to 3.8% in December 2022, as the state added 1.31 million jobs and now has more jobs than it did pre-Covid.
- Led to record 959,000 new Small Business Applications in Texas: In 2021 and 2022, Texans applied to start 959,000 new businesses, the highest 2-year total on record.
- ARP Provided Direct Pandemic Recovery Funds to All 1,400 Texas towns, cities, and counties – avoiding cuts and investing in public safety, housing, workforce development, and other critical areas.
- Provided Vital Education Funding to 1,000 School Districts in Texas to support
  academic recovery and student mental health and reopen safely: 1,000 school districts
  in Texas were provided funding to support academic recovery and student mental
  health and reopen safely.
- 10,649 Child Care Programs in Texas Received Support to Help Keep Their Doors Open, impacting up to 826,000 children.
- Working Family Tax Relief through the Expanded Child Tax Credit for 3.9 million Texas families with 6.7 million children: In Texas, the American Rescue Plan's historic Child Tax Credit benefited an estimated 3.9 million families with 6.7 million children.
- Expanded Earned Income Tax Credit for 1.4 million workers in Texas: The American Rescue Plan's expanded EITC provided up to \$1,500 of tax relief to an estimated 1.4 million Texas workers without dependent children.
- Saved 1.8 million Texans an average of \$564 per year on their health care: In 2022, 1.8 million Texans saved an average of \$564 on their health premiums from the American Rescue Plan. With the Inflation Reduction Act's extension of these savings, a record 2.4 million Texans signed up for quality, affordable care in the 2023 ACA open enrollment period.
- Emergency Rental Assistance to Thousands of Hard-Pressed Renters in Texas: In Texas, state and local governments made 671,000 payments to help families meet their ongoing rent and utilities costs and 595,000 payments to help families address past due rent and utility bills.
- 1 million Texas College Students received direct financial relief through the Higher Education Emergency Relief Program in 2021 alone: In 2021, 259 Texas colleges and universities made direct financial assistance payments to 1 million college students to help them stay enrolled and cover their bills.
- 152,000 more Texas homes and businesses will receive affordable, high-speed internet through the American Rescue Plan's Capital Project Fund.
- American Rescue Plan's Emergency Connectivity Fund is addressing the homework gap for 805,000 Texas students: providing about 1725,000 connected devices (including hotspots) for students.
- 6,376 Texas Restaurants received vital relief through the American Rescue Plan's Restaurant Revitalization Fund.
