

The American Rescue Plan's Impact on Utah on Two-Year Anniversary

- Powered a Strong Recovery with Utah unemployment falling to 2.4%: Utah's unemployment rate has fallen from 3.4% in January 2021 to 2.4% in December 2022, as the state added 96,000 jobs and now has more jobs than it did pre-Covid.
- Led to record 128,000 new Small Business Applications in Utah: In 2021 and 2022, Utahns applied to start 128,000 new businesses, the highest 2-year total on record.
- ARP Provided Direct Pandemic Recovery Funds to All 273 Utah towns, cities, and counties – avoiding cuts and investing in public safety, housing, workforce development, and other critical areas.
- Provided Vital Education Funding to 41 School Districts in Utah to support academic recovery and student mental health and reopen safely: 41 school districts in Utah were provided funding to support academic recovery and student mental health and reopen safely.
- 1,530 Child Care Programs in Utah Received Support to Help Keep Their Doors Open, impacting up to 81,000 children.
- Working Family Tax Relief through the Expanded Child Tax Credit for 423K Utah families with 851K children: In Utah, the American Rescue Plan's historic Child Tax Credit benefited an estimated 423,000 families with 851,000 children.
- Expanded Earned Income Tax Credit for 138K workers in Utah: The American Rescue Plan's expanded EITC provided up to \$1,500 of tax relief to an estimated 138,000 Utah workers without dependent children.
- Saved 257,000 Utahns an average of \$636 per year on their health care: In 2022, 257,000 Utahan, Utahns saved an average of \$636 on their health premiums from the American Rescue Plan. With the Inflation Reduction Act's extension of these savings, a record 295,000 Utahan, Utahns signed up for quality, affordable care in the 2023 ACA open enrollment period.
- Emergency Rental Assistance to Thousands of Hard-Pressed Renters in Utah: In Utah, state and local governments made 51,000 payments to help families meet their ongoing rent and utilities costs and 52,000 payments to help families address past due rent and utility bills.
- 181,000 Utah College Students received direct financial relief through the Higher Education Emergency Relief Program in 2021 alone: In 2021, 37 Utah colleges and universities made direct financial assistance payments to 181,000 college students to help them stay enrolled and cover their bills.
- 3,000 more Utah homes and businesses will receive affordable, high-speed internet through the American Rescue Plan's Capital Project Fund.
- American Rescue Plan's Emergency Connectivity Fund is addressing the homework gap for 23,000 Utah students: providing about 109,000 connected devices (including hotspots) for students.
- 468 Utah Restaurants received vital relief through the American Rescue Plan's Restaurant Revitalization Fund.
