Statement from OMB Director Shalanda Young

Budgetary Impact Analysis for Executive Order Entitled "Moving Beyond COVID-19 Vaccination Requirements for Federal Workers"

This executive order would revoke Executive Order 14042 and Executive Order 14043, which, respectively, imposed specified COVID-19 safety protocols for Federal contractors and required COVID-19 vaccination for Federal employees. Implementing this executive order would have no impact on costs and revenues to the Federal Government. The benefits of this executive order include updating Government-wide policy to reflect the substantial improvements in public health and safety, and in the resiliency of the healthcare system, since Executive Orders 14042 and 14043 were issued in September 2021. Implementing this executive order would have no impact on mandatory and discretionary obligations and outlays, as well as on revenues to the Federal Government, in the 5-year fiscal period beginning in fiscal year 2023. The agencies anticipated to be impacted by this executive order include all applicable executive departments and agencies.
