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Statement from OMB Director Shalanda Young

**Budgetary Impact Analysis for Executive Order Entitled
“Interagency Security Committee”**

This executive order supersedes Executive Order 12977 of October 19, 1995, which established the Interagency Security Committee (ISC). The ISC collaboratively establishes security standards and policies for domestic non-military Federal facilities, monitors compliance of these standards, and otherwise enhances the security and protection of Federal facilities. This executive order seeks to incorporate lessons learned since the ISC’s inception more than 25 years ago, and address current and evolving challenges faced by those entrusted to secure Federal facilities. Implementing this executive order would have no impact on costs and revenues to the Federal Government. The benefits of this executive order include mandating compliance reporting and increasing accountability of those responsible for implementing security standards at Federal facilities. Implementing this executive order would have no impact on mandatory and discretionary obligations and outlays, as well as on revenues to the Federal Government, in the 5-year fiscal period beginning in fiscal year 2024. The agencies anticipated to be impacted by this executive order include primarily the Department of Homeland Security, as it chairs the Interagency Security Committee, but also numerous other Executive Branch departments and agencies.
