President Biden's Affordable Connectivity Program is Delivering in District of Columbia

As of February 2024

High-speed internet is necessary for Americans to do their jobs, participate in school, access health care, and stay connected.

The Affordable Connectivity Program, enacted under President Biden's Bipartisan Infrastructure Law as the largest internet affordability program in our nation's history, is already helping 23 million households across the country save \$30-\$75 each per month on their monthly internet bills. And, because the Biden-Harris Administration worked with internet providers to offer high-speed internet plans that are fully covered by the Affordable Connectivity Program, working families in District of Columbia can now get high-speed internet for *free*.

More than 63,391 households across the District of Columbia have benefitted from the Affordable Connectivity Program, but the program will run out of funding as soon as spring 2024 if Congress does not act now.

In District of Columbia:

- **Enrollment to date:** Today, 63,391 District of Columbia households are enrolled in the Affordable Connectivity Program. That's about 1 in 5 households in the district.
- **Funding to date:** District of Columbia has received \$33,830,515 in funding from the Affordable Connectivity Program. That means District of Columbia families are saving about \$1.8 million total each month.
