Dear Mr. Speaker:

Section 251(a)(7) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 (BBEDCA) (2 U.S.C. § 901(a)(7)) requires that the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) submit a report to the Congress on discretionary appropriations legislation within seven calendar days of enactment (excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays). The "Seven-Day-After" report must contain the OMB and Congressional Budget Office (CBO) estimates of discretionary new budget authority provided by the legislation and an explanation of any differences between the two estimates.

Enclosed is the Seven-Day-After report for the Rescissions Act of 2025 (Public Law 119-28). The Act rescinds certain budget authority that was proposed to be rescinded in special messages transmitted to the Congress by the President on June 3, 2025 in accordance with section 1012(a) of the Congressional Budget and Impoundment Control Act of 1974 (2 U.S.C. § 683(a)). The President signed the Act into law on July 24, 2025. Public Law 119-28 did not enact any new budget authority. Rather, it enacted discretionary rescissions. These changes do not necessitate a change in the discretionary spending limits included in the OMB Final Sequestration Report to the President and Congress for Fiscal Year 2025 that was released on April 1, 2025 and included in Table 2 of this report. Accordingly, no sequestration update report in August will be issued because there is no change to the discretionary spending limits for 2025.
