STATEMENT OF ADMINISTRATION POLICY

H.R. 498 – Do No Harm in Medicaid Act

(Rep. Crenshaw, R-TX, and four cosponsors)

H.R. 3492 – Protect Children’s Innocence Act

(Rep. Greene, R-GA, and 44 cosponsors)

The Administration strongly supports passage of H.R. 498, the Do No Harm in Medicaid Act, and H.R. 3492, the Protect Children’s Innocence Act. H.R. 498 would prohibit Medicaid funding for chemical and surgical procedures that mutilate and disfigure children and adolescents under the guise of supposed “gender transition.” H.R. 3492 would prohibit the performing of genital or bodily mutilation or chemical castration procedures on minors, and make such conduct punishable by fine, imprisonment for up to ten years, or both. Across the country today, medical professionals are maiming and sterilizing impressionable children under the radical and false claim that adults can change a child’s sex through irreversible medical interventions. This dangerous practice will be a stain on our Nation’s history, and it must end. President Trump made a promise to end divisive gender ideology that ignores basic biological truth and harms children. While much progress has been made by this Administration, Congress must ensure that taxpayers are never funding such destructive and life-altering procedures, and that Medicaid funding is appropriately spent on legitimate and lawful medical care for the most vulnerable Americans. Congress must also ensure that individuals who perform genital or bodily mutilation or chemical castration procedures on minors face the criminal penalties that they deserve.

If H.R. 498 and H.R. 3492 were presented to the President, his advisors would recommend that he sign them into law.
