STATEMENT OF ADMINISTRATION POLICY

H.R. 6359 – Pregnant Students’ Rights Act
(Rep. Hinson, R-IA, and three cosponsors)

H.R. 6945 – Supporting Pregnant and Parenting Women and Families Act
(Rep. Fischbach, R-MN, and 14 cosponsors)

The Administration strongly supports passage of H.R. 6359, the Pregnant Students’ Rights Act, and H.R. 6945, the Supporting Pregnant and Parenting Women and Families Act. Pregnant women, especially young mothers, deserve access to resources and information that will help them and their babies through pregnancy and parenthood after birth.

The Pregnant Students’ Rights Act would ensure that young pregnant women are given sufficient information about their rights and the support resources available to them on college campuses, including flexible class schedules and excused absences. Similarly, the Supporting Pregnant and Parenting Women and Families Act would clarify that TANF funds can be used to support pregnancy centers. Following attempts by the Biden administration to strip away this flexibility, this bill would ensure that States can continue partnering with pregnancy centers that provide medical care, parenting classes, and material assistance, such as diapers and formula, to women and families in need.

Taken together, H.R. 6359 and H.R. 6945 help build a culture of life by protecting the rights of young mothers on campus and ensuring greater access to health care and supportive resources for expectant families through pregnancy centers. Such an approach puts mothers, fathers, and families first and promotes a culture that cherishes life and protects the most vulnerable among us.

If H.R. 6359 and H.R. 6945 were presented to the President in their current form, his advisors would recommend that he sign them into law.

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
