STATEMENT OF ADMINISTRATION POLICY
S. Con. Res. 33 – Setting forth the congressional budget for the United States Government for fiscal year 2026 and setting forth the appropriate budgetary levels for fiscal years 2027 through 2035.
(Sen. Graham, R-SC)

The Administration strongly supports S. Con. Res. 33. This budget resolution is an essential step toward fully funding Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) and Border Patrol for the remainder of President Trump’s term through the budget reconciliation process.

Congressional Democrats have abdicated their responsibility to fund the Government, opting instead to shut down the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) in an attempt to protect violent criminal illegal aliens and undermine the President’s highly successful border security agenda. The Trump Administration and congressional Republicans stand united in their refusal to acquiesce to Democrat intransigence.

Passage of S. Con. Res. 33 will enable congressional Republicans to quickly pass a budget reconciliation bill by June 1st that fully funds ICE and Border Patrol through fiscal year (FY) 2029. This process ensures congressional Democrats can no longer leverage funding for the hardworking men and women of ICE and Border Patrol to hamper the Administration’s successful agenda to protect the Homeland.

In conjunction with the Senate Amendment to H.R. 7147, the reconciliation bill made possible by S. Con. Res. 33 will finally end congressional Democrats’ nearly 10-week shutdown of DHS, which has wreaked havoc on the safety and security of the American people. The Administration is committed to working closely with both the House and the Senate to pass a reconciliation bill by June 1st. To do so, the Congress must pass this budget resolution, as is, immediately.

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
