STATEMENT OF ADMINISTRATION POLICY

H.R. 6398 – Reducing and Eliminating Duplicative Environmental Regulations (RED Tape) Act

(Rep. Joyce, R-PA)

The Administration strongly supports passage of H.R. 6398, the Reducing and Eliminating Duplicative Environmental Regulations (RED Tape) Act. The bill would eliminate overlapping environmental reviews by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and speed up permitting and project implementation.

H.R. 6398 would remove the requirement under the Clean Air Act for the EPA to review federal construction projects and other major federal actions that are already subject to environmental review under the National Environmental Policy Act. The bill would prevent the EPA from conducting separate reviews of the same project or regulation, eliminating redundant and costly reviews. The Administration is committed to putting the American people first by cutting red tape and investing in infrastructure that will lead to job creation, energy dominance, and economic growth.

If this bill were presented to the President in its current form, his advisors would recommend that he sign it into law.
