STATEMENT OF ADMINISTRATION POLICY

H.R. 4690 – Reliable Federal Infrastructure Act

(Rep. Langworthy, R-NY, and seven cosponsors)

The Administration strongly supports passage of H.R. 4690, the Reliable Federal Infrastructure Act. The bill would eliminate burdensome Federal building mandates that no longer align with modern construction realities.

H.R. 4690 would repeal a provision of the Energy Independence and Security Act of 2007, which requires a reduction and eventual elimination of fossil fuel-generated energy consumption by newly constructed or renovated Federal buildings. These one-size-fits-all requirements, enacted during an aggressive Federal climate policy push, perpetuate an electrification mandate for energy used in Federal buildings, jeopardizing the reliability and security of our Nation's critical infrastructure. The bill would eliminate these outdated requirements, prioritizing practicality and savings for taxpayers.

If this bill were presented to the President in its current form, his advisors would recommend that he sign it into law.
