STATEMENT OF ADMINISTRATION POLICY

H.R. 7567 – Farm, Food, and National Security Act of 2026

(Rep. Thompson, R-PA)

President Trump supports swift passage of the Farm Bill. The Administration appreciates the work of the House Agriculture Committee on H.R. 7567, the Farm, Food, and National Security Act of 2026, a bill that provides a comprehensive, five-year reauthorization of critical food and agriculture programs. After multiple short-term extensions of the 2018 Farm Bill, enactment of the new Farm Bill will provide certainty and long-term stability that farmers, ranchers, and rural communities need to plan, invest, and grow.

President Trump's Working Families Tax Cuts provided the most funding for American farmers and ranchers in at least a generation, providing stronger farm safety net programs as well as crop insurance and disaster programs. It also increased accountability in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) through stronger work requirements and incentives for States to lower excessive payment errors, saving taxpayers over \$200 billion over the next decade. H.R. 7567 delivers additional stability by strengthening the farm safety net, expanding access to credit, and enhancing risk management tools that help producers navigate volatile markets, rising input costs, and global competition.

H.R. 7567 supports agricultural exports and trade relationships that expand opportunities for U.S. producers while ensuring Americans continue to enjoy the most abundant, reliable, and affordable food supply in the world. The bill will also lower energy, housing, and household costs by expanding rural energy programs, expand access to credit, and promote active forest management that decreases the risk of catastrophic wildfire and to increase the supply of timber to help with construction costs.

The Administration looks forward to working with the Congress to address certain items in H.R. 7567 following its passage in the House and prior to enactment. Specifically, the Administration notes the historic work of the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) to eradicate fraud, waste, and abuse of SNAP and hopes to see language that ensures all States agree to reasonable protocols for sharing applicant and participant information, among other program integrity initiatives. The Administration would like to continue to work with Congress to ensure Presidential authorities related to USDA's crop insurance program are not constrained.

The Administration also would prefer to retain flexibility to determine the best approach to wildfire suppression based on conditions on the ground, including firefighter safety, communities at risk, and available resources.

The Administration supports House passage of this bill and looks forward to working with the Congress to enact a multi-year Farm Bill that provides long-term certainty to our farmers, ranchers and rural America, all while addressing and preventing nutrition program fraud.
