STATEMENT OF ADMINISTRATION POLICY

S.J. Res. 99 – Joint Resolution Providing for Congressional Disapproval of the Rule Submitted by U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services relating to “Removal of the Automatic Extension of Employment Authorization Documents”

(Sen. Rosen, D-NV, and 11 cosponsors)

The Administration strongly opposes passage of S.J. Res. 99, which would disapprove a rule recently issued by the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services. Biden-era immigration policies encouraged a historically high influx of aliens applying for work permits, resulting in the filing of over 3 million employment authorization applications. This overwhelming flood of aliens seeking employment authorization continues to bog down agency processing times and adjudicative resources.

To address this unmanageable influx of applications, the Biden Administration allowed an alien’s work authorization to be automatically extended for up to 540 days while their renewal application was waiting to be reviewed. These automatic extensions resulted in a substantial number of aliens being permitted to continue working lawfully without undergoing appropriate vetting and screening. Through this rule, President Trump rightfully ended the practice of automatically extending employment authorization to aliens, enhancing public safety.

If S.J. Res. 99 were presented to the President, his advisors would recommend that he veto it.
