## **STATEMENT OF ADMINISTRATION POLICY**

### **H.R. 9237 – Take Care of America’s Veterans Act**

(Rep. Bost, R-IL, and 30 cosponsors)

The Administration supports Congress’ efforts to advance the President’s priorities of improving access to high-quality health care for veterans, modernizing aging Department of Veterans Affairs infrastructure, strengthening support for veterans, warfighters, their families and survivors, and ensuring responsible stewardship of taxpayer dollars. The Take Care of America’s Veterans Act contains several important provisions that further these objectives, including codifying the eligibility requirements for veterans’ access to community care, authorizing modernization and replacement of a New Hampshire medical facility, and enhancing support for our veterans, caregivers, families, and survivors. The Administration also appreciates Congress reaching an agreement to responsibly address issues affecting certain combat-injured servicemembers.

The Administration notes that, at the timing of the issuance of this Statement of Administration Policy, a final score for the bill is not yet available. The Administration also looks forward to working with Congress to ensure any reforms in the bill are administratively feasible and consistent with the President’s commitment to ensuring our wounded warriors and their families receive the full support they deserve. The Administration also has concerns with provisions of the bill related to the U.S. Court of Appeals for Veterans Claims, as well as the request for documents protected by executive privilege, and looks forward to working with Congress to address these concerns.

President Trump is committed to delivering results for veterans, cutting red tape, and making the VA work better for those who have sacrificed so much for our country. The Administration supports inclusion of important Presidential priorities in H.R. 9237 and looks forward to working with Congress on passage of the Take Care of America’s Veterans Act.

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
