STATEMENT OF ADMINISTRATION POLICY

H.R. 9576 – National Fraud Enforcement Division Act of 2026

(Rep. Finstad, R-MN, and four cosponsors)

The Administration strongly supports passage of H.R. 9576, which would codify in Federal law the creation of the National Fraud Enforcement Division as a stand-alone division within the U.S. Department of Justice. Historically, when newly pressing crime issues have faced our country and have required a newly focused Federal response, the Justice Department has on occasion created new divisions to oversee and coordinate Federal criminal investigations and prosecutions in such newly relevant substantive areas. Most recently, early in the Global War on Terror, the Justice Department established the National Security Division, which has played a critical role in protecting the United States from threats to our national security in the two decades since that new division was formed.

The Trump-Vance Administration has launched a new War on Fraud to address the widespread waste, fraud, and abuse that plague our Nation's Federal benefits programs. Thus far, the Administration has uncovered an astounding nearly \$250 billion in fraud. This massive fraud problem requires a focused Federal response. A key component to that response has been the creation of the National Fraud Enforcement Division, which provides a home for a centralized group of criminal investigators and prosecutors to oversee and coordinate Federal efforts to bring to justice those who commit fraud against the American people.

H.R. 9576 would codify the creation of the National Fraud Enforcement Division and would ensure that future administrations will not roll back this important step toward ensuring that fraud against the American people is effectively investigated and prosecuted.

If H.R. 9576 were presented to the President, his senior advisors would recommend that he sign it into law.

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
