SUBJECT: Update on the Federal Data Center Consolidation Initiative

The goals of the Federal Data Center Consolidation Initiative are to assist agencies in identifying their existing data center assets and to formulate consolidation plans that include a technical roadmap and consolidation targets. The Initiative aims to address the growth of data centers and assist agencies in leveraging best practices from the public and private sector to:

- Promote the use of Green IT by reducing the overall energy and real estate footprint of government data centers;
- Reduce the cost of data center hardware, software and operations;
- Increase the overall IT security posture of the government; and,
- Shift IT investments to more efficient computing platforms and technologies.

In February 2010, the Administration launched the Federal Data Center Consolidation Initiative and issued guidance for CIO Council agencies. This guidance called for agencies to inventory current data center assets, develop consolidation plans throughout fiscal year 2010, and integrate these plans into agency fiscal year 2012 budget submissions.

Over the past eight months, agencies have collected and refined their data center inventory based on a common definition of a data center and a rigorous peer review process. For the purposes of this Initiative, a data center is defined as:


- Any room that is greater than 500 square feet and devoted to data processing; and,
- Meets one of the tier (I, II, III & IV) classifications defined by the Uptime Institute¹.

This common definition coupled with a rigorous peer review process has resulted in a more complete picture of agency data center assets. As of July 30, 2010, based on agency submissions, there are 2,094 Federal data centers. As part of the President's fiscal year 2012 budget, OMB will release data center reduction targets by agency.

Throughout the fall of 2010, CIO Council agencies will work with OMB to review, adjust and finalize data center consolidation plans. OMB will approve agency consolidation plans by December 31, 2010.

Pursuant to the data center consolidation guidance, the following table outlines key deliverables and their status:
