Dear Mr. Speaker:

Section 251(a)(7) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 requires that the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) submit a report to the Congress on discretionary appropriations legislation within seven calendar days of enactment (excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays). The "Seven-Day-After" report must contain the OMB and Congressional Budget Office (CBO) estimates of discretionary new budget authority provided by the legislation and an explanation of any differences between the two estimates.

Enclosed is the report for the Continuing Appropriations Act, 2018 and Supplemental Appropriations for Disaster Relief Requirements Act, 2017 (Public Law 115-56). The President signed the Act into law on September 8, 2017. The enclosure includes an appropriations Seven-Day-After report on FY 2017 supplemental appropriations contained in divisions B and D of the Act.

The amounts in the report reflect OMB scoring for supplemental appropriations provided for FY 2017. The report does not include estimates of continuing appropriations for FY 2018 provided in division D of the Act. Divisions A and C have no budgetary effects counted towards the discretionary spending limits.

2 The FY 2017 and FY 2018 spending limits for the defense (or "revised security") and non-defense (or "revised nonsecurity") categories and for the appropriations previously enacted for FY 2017 are equal to the amounts published in the OMB Sequestration Update Report to the President and Congress for Fiscal Year 2018 (see OMB's website: https://www.whitehouse.gov/omb/public-releases/omb-reports).

3 Section 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 (BBEDCA) authorizes an adjustment to the caps for appropriations that are designated by the Congress, and subsequently designated by the President, as emergency requirements or for Overseas Contingency Operations/Global War on Terrorism. Divisions B and D of Public Law 115-56 include supplemental funding for these activities with the appropriate designations as emergency requirements and the President transmitted to the Congress on September 8, 2017 his subsequent designations of all of these amounts. These amounts are summarized here and are not included in the totals displayed above that are counted against the caps. The adjustments to the discretionary limits to reflect this spending are not included in this report but will be included in OMB's Final Sequestration Report for 2018.
